Whatever it might have been, hopefully the next time around the membership should try their best to make it to our Club Assembly as evidence of their continuing interest in what is happening within the Club and the District. Perhaps the BOD would look into ways to getting members informed in good time, maybe with a personal touch even if there is nothing wrong to communicate through the internet.

The fact that majority of the attendees at this said Club Assembly were Past Presidents does not auger well for the Club. These Pudu stalwarts even if they are not Rotary weary, will surely be energized by the enthusiasm and interest of the present younger membership and would want to continue to serve as diligently. But age is creeping up and one couldn't help but worry about what will happen to our Club if the successors are less or not interested in how the Club is run, or what the direction of the Club will be in the medium and long term. Who will replace the likes of those of our still very active Past Presidents, or in time who will replace the current crop of very active newer Rotarians.

Is our succession planning proceeding smoothly to see our Club rise up to the occasion to stay as one of the most active in the District? Or will our Club fall prey to apathy and become a pale shadow of what once was an active and respected Club.

We make the choice and if we believe we all can make the difference, for surely we can, we have to make the choice now. 61 members with almost 50 % made up of Past Presidents will soon spell problem if we choose not to care.

PP Michael Yeow introduced our speaker Mario A. Del Castillo, PHD.

He is a consultant in the field of strategic leadership which, in a nutshell, means he assist leaders of organizations, be they large or small, with their process of establishing strategic direction. He also teach Leadership Dynamics at the MBA level for the University of South Australia. In addition, he also conduct leadership development programs based on the Kouzes and Posner Leadership Practices Inventory (LPI) and Dr. John C. Maxwell's Developing the Leader Within You.

His experience in leading volunteers comes from his years in Kiwanis International where he has served in various positions including Club Secretary, Club President (KC Damansara), and as Lt. Governor, Division 5.

He has a PHD in Organizational Development.

### ***The Speech***

---



Our speaker this week Mr. Mario A. Del Castillo very eloquently and clearly went straight into the theme of his speech which was "Leading in Volunteer Groups".

He said that if one can lead a volunteer group it would be

the best test for gauging the level of performance since in a voluntary organization you cannot tell directly but you will need the ability to influence others to achieve the goals set out. One needs to connect and relationship evolves from the heart, not from one's title.

He explained John Maxells 5 keys to the secret of leading in volunteer groups, namely:

1. Position
2. Relationship
3. People Development
4. Performance
5. Personhood

Along the way he emphasized the need for experience to be rewarding, fun that will lead to one volunteering willingly. There is need to have an exciting vision, trust, fun and above all to be able to see one as part of a larger community.

He then talk of the need for a leader to "deposit into EQ bank account" i.e. to invest one's time, to respond to the need of others, build relationship, make good promises and follow the golden rule of "do unto others as you would have them do unto you".

Closing he emphasized the need to make one's leadership "redundant" so as to pass on and spread leadership and skill on to others. Ensure always there is good fellowship as it the "glue, fuel that keeps the club going", and not forgetting to resolve problems amicably. He elaborated on the 4 BIG Words:

- PLEASE
- SORRY
- IT'S ALRIGHT
- THANKS

In answering our members questions he stress that in volunteer organization volunteers have no contractual responsibility, only moral responsibility. A president in a club like Pudu is a "leader amongst leaders" and seasoned past leaders should mentor rather than lead or direct the president who is after all the elected CEO.

PDG Paul Lee thanked the speaker for a thoughtful provoking talk.

About Save Our Seafood Campaign and the film The End of the Line

Scientists predict that if we continue fishing as we are now, we will see the end of most seafood by 2048. Imagine an ocean without fish. Imagine your meals without seafood. **Dow Repeats Great Depression Pattern: Charts**

The Dow Jones Industrial Average is repeating a pattern that appeared just before markets fell during the Great Depression, Daryl Guppy, CEO at Guppytraders.com, told CNBC Monday.

“Those who don’t remember history are doomed to repeat it ... there was a head and shoulders pattern that developed before the Depression in 1929, then with the recovery in 1930 we had another head and shoulders pattern that preceded a fall in the market, and in the current Dow situation we see an exact repeat of that environment,” Guppy said.

The Dow retreated 457.33 points, or 4.5 percent last week, to close at 9686 Friday. Guppy said a Dow fall below 9,800 confirmed the head and shoulders pattern.

The Shanghai Composite is seeing a very rapid collapse, falling below 2,500, which suggests the major fall in the Dow, he added.

In the European markets, Guppy says Frankfurt’s Dax is witnessing a different pattern to London FTSE.

Guppy uses the broad trading band as measurement – giving the Dax a downsize target of 1,500. The same head and shoulders pattern seen in the Dow can also being seen in the FTSE, he added.
