The Nominating Committee (NC) can be a mystery to many Rotarians. Actually the NC is provided for under the By-Laws of our Club. In Article I: ELECTIONS OF DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS, it is stated that “if it is determined to have a nominating committee, such committee shall be appointed as the club may determine”. In Pudu it has been decided that the nominating committee shall consist of all the Past Presidents of the club. And in Pudu the past presidents collectively form the unofficial “Past Presidents’ Council”. Of course Past Presidents are but ordinary members of the club.

Basically the duty of the NC is to “propose to the Club a list of nominees to be the Board of Directors for the ensuing year”. The reasoning has been that the Past Presidents “have vast knowledge of the club and without any vested interest, they are in the best position to ensure a smooth transition of Club leadership succession.”

It normally works this way. The Incoming President (i.e. President Elect) attends the official Nominating Committee Meetings and proposes a list of names for the NC to consider and deliberate. All positions are carefully evaluated but the names for the positions of President Elect and Vice President remain the prerogative of the Past Presidents Council.

The positions of the PE and VP are normally filled by candidates who want and will move up higher in the administrative hierarchy in time to come. This way continuity has a better chance to succeed and these two positions are at all times very important and critical for the continuing well-being of the Club.

At the AGM the nominations are tabled but the floor can propose candidates to vie for any positions. Thus democracy prevails and this system to date has worked well for Pudu. We have great continuity and generally most of our club’s leaders who went on to become President have invariably gained immense experience in human relationship and leadership. At the end of the day Rotary’s motto of “service above self” can be very meaningful when one and all have the Club and Rotary’s interests at heart.

December looms near for even as the Club is busy preparing for the 76th RI District 3300 Conference, numerous meetings of the Nominating Committee have already taken place and when the AGM is called, the list of candidates nominated would have been in place.

**Works of Rotarians**

My favourite section of The Rotarian Magazine is the “World Roundup” which gives us Rotary news in brief from around the world.

I am always fascinated by the types of work and projects that are being carried out by clubs from different continents. For example, in the less developed countries, their Rotary Clubs focus on more fundamental physical needs like giving out hearing aids and wheelchairs. In the more wealthy nations, they do projects that are more of “self-actualization” for example like promoting peace in schools through conflict resolution tools, celebrate Mothers’ Day in honour of foster mothers.

Some of the most amazing projects take Rotary work across continents. These are a couple of fine examples:

- A Rotary Club in Australia raised funds from their own community to build health clinic and houses in a remote village in Sri Lanka that was devastated by the 2004 tsunami.
- An American Rotarian initiated a “Crutches 4 Africa” project in the US to collect used crutches, canes and wheelchairs to be given away to people in the African countries.

Looking back at our own club this year, RC Pudu has carried out a wide range of projects including caring for the community by visiting old folk’s home and promoting a green environment; nurturing the new generations through leadership training and Interact club activities; promoting literacy through elocution contests; honoring the vocations through recognizing NGOs; fostering international understanding by fellowship with Rotarians from other countries, including our sister clubs.

In addition, within the next few weeks, RC Pudu will be launching two meaningful community projects utilising its Matching Grant funds from The Rotary Foundation and contributions from partner clubs.

No matter what projects we Rotarians do, whether large or small, local or international, we are all working towards making this world a better place for everyone to live in.

Fellow Rotarians, keep up your good work!

### ***C.V. of Speaker***

---

Mr. Philip Koh Tong Ngee is an advocate and solicitor High Court Malaya. Aged 56 he is a Law graduate from the University of Malaya. He also hold a Master of Laws degree from the University of London and Masters of Arts (Theology) from the Australian Catholic University.

He has an illustrious career that included a period in the corporate world, and serves as Member of Private Sector Advisory Group of Global Corporate Governance Forum based in Washington, International Finance Corporation/World Bank. Currently he is a senior partner of Messrs Mah-Kamariyah & Philip Koh.

He was an Adviser and Founding Board member of the Malaysian Institute for Corporate Governance. He was a member of the Corporate Law Reform Committee that is working on a major law reform initiative on the Malaysian Company Legislation.

He has served on numerous committees that included the Ethics Committee which looked into the IFAC Code of Ethics for the Malaysian Institute of Accountants

and has served as a member of the KLSE Audit Sub-Committee (2002-2004)

On top of all his achievements he publishes regularly in learned journals and financial news media that included Country reports to World Bank and OECD on corporate governance and Insolvency law reform. He was co-author of "The Law of Contract in Malaysia and Singapore – Cases and Commentary" (Oxford)1979) and others .

Mr. Koh is a much sought after speaker and workshop facilitator for international, commonwealth and national conferences on corporate governance. He also presented paper on Blogging at BUM (Bloggers United Malaysia), Law of Disabled and Challenges of Higher Education.

### ***Speaker's Text***

---

Our learned speaker Mr. PHILIP T.N. KOH was introduced by a fellow legal member PP KEN ONG.

Mr. Koh gave a very interesting and pertinent account on the topic "BOARD OF DIRECTORS DECISION MAKING: RULES AND REALITIES IN CORPORATE GROUPS that covers the definition of a Corporation, Governance Expectations, and legal definition under Sec.131B of the Companies Act. He noted that today "professionals" tend to venture into "business", and on the other hand "businesses" is gravitating towards being more "professional".

Directors in a corporation is known to take "longer" view in business dealings with due consideration of the interests of the group as a whole when making decisions and not sacrificing any company within the group (Intraco v Multi-Pak, Singapore)

Directors are not expected to live in an "unreal region of altruism", but are expected to act with intelligence and honesty. Risk taking is expected but Directors must discharge their functions in the "honest and reasonable belief "that they were for the best interest of the company.

Delegation of duties does not mean that Directors can "abdicate" their responsibility. They are expected to exercise reasonable care, skill and diligence with:

- a) the knowledge, skill and experience which may reasonably be expected of a director having same responsibilities; and
- b) any additional knowledge, skill and experience which the director in fact has

The fiduciary duties would have three major aspects:

- a) NO Conflict Rule
- b) NO Corporate opportunity
- c) NO Abuse of Powers.

In the real world they can often exert tremendous pressure on the Management and Board regarding decision making. Moral decision can conflict with professional decision when there is a desire to conform, to please clients, superiors. But there should not be any short changing when it comes to acting professionally

and intellectually. Powerful patrons can exert undue pressure.

The moral is to do the right things and be willing to draw the line. Be willing to say "NO" when it isn't right.

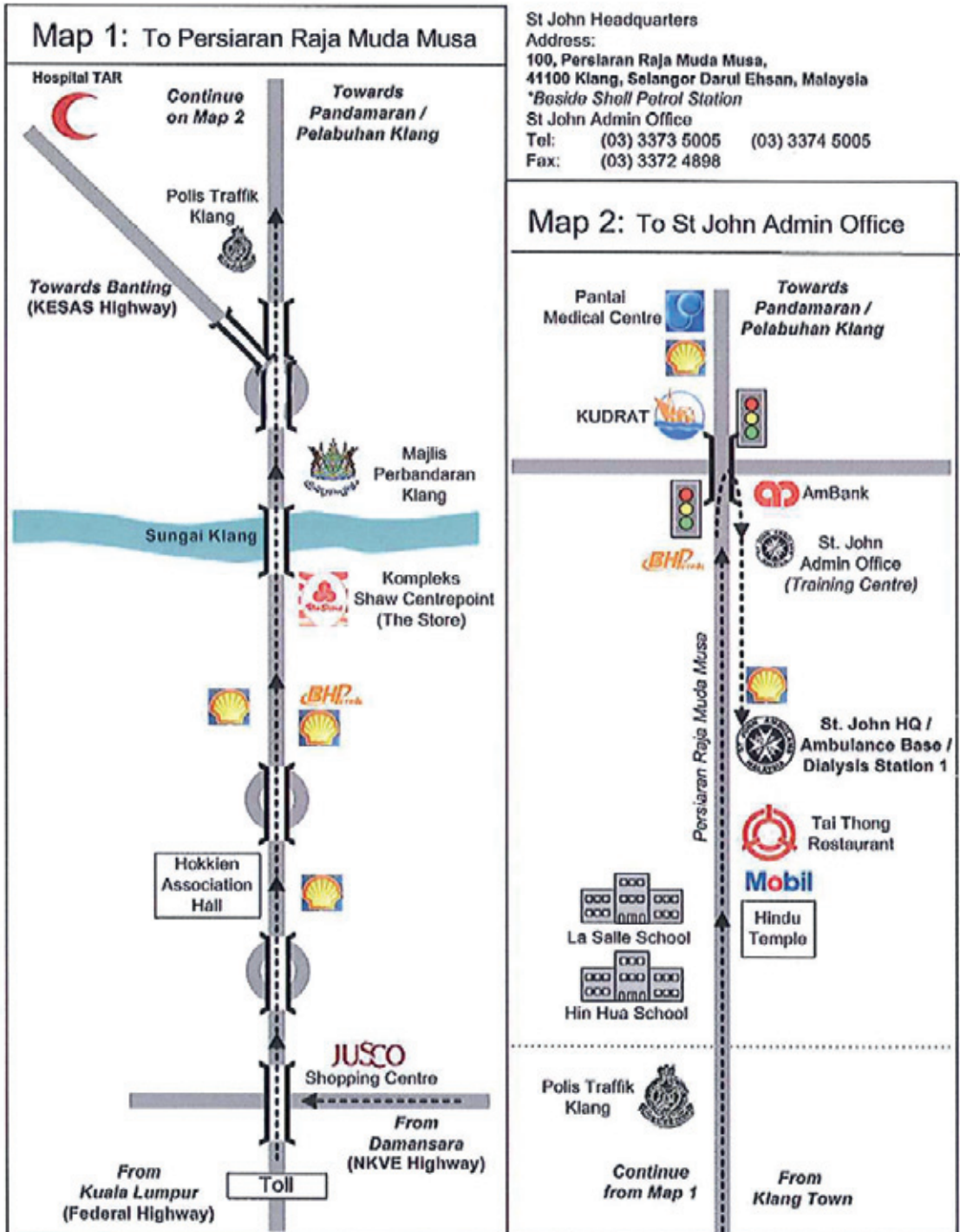

**Membership database integration now available for Rotary clubs and districts**

Rotary International News – 1 November 2010

Rotary International's new OneRotary database integration initiative allows Rotary clubs and districts to link their databases directly to the master membership database maintained at RI World Headquarters.

OneRotary is now available to clubs and districts using ClubRunner, the first company to offer this integration feature to its customers. ClubRunner has worked closely with RI to establish technical guidelines, and several other database providers anticipate offering the OneRotary integration feature in the coming months. Clubs should contact their provider for more details.

OneRotary aims to simplify how Rotary clubs and districts communicate with RI and to improve the quality of information used to support them. For example, when a club member's contact information is updated in a club's database, the information is automatically updated in RI's database as well. This integration eliminates duplicate data entry efforts and gives Rotary clubs more accurate semiannual reports.

Participation is voluntary. Clubs and districts retain their autonomy and may opt in or out of OneRotary

at any time. For security and privacy reasons, a club can only view and update its own member information.
