Many wealthy individuals and businesses do not like other individuals, companies or governments looking at their financial affairs especially if they have done nothing wrong.

Privacy is at the core of all of our advice.

We have a very wealthy client whose concerns are – currency restrictions and money movement restrictions, he is also worried about a potential change in government. Although he has done many legitimate government contracts his concern is a new government may wish to challenge these contracts and ask for some of the money to be repaid. Currency

Russia and China are presently trying to stop the US\$ being the world currency. The US\$ is presently a stronger currency than it should really be – one of the major reasons it has not slumped is because of China (China is Americas bank). China owns a huge amount of US\$ and a huge amount of US debt – so it is not in their interest to let the currency go down in value. This is one reason why China is purchasing large amounts of gold. China have recently bought 200tonnes of gold along with India who have also bought 200 tonnes.

Midas -3 Areas of my personal expertise which I was asked to come to Malaysia for was; QROPS – originally this was for UK expatriates who have pension schemes in the UK and under the European freedom of movement of money they can move their pension schemes offshore and manage them with our help. However, since moving here it has become apparent that many professional Malaysians have worked in the UK and have pension schemes that they have forgotten about. We have the ability to transfer their schemes to be managed with our help here in Malaysia.
